

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

How do I submit my article?

Please submit your article online. Electronic submission substantially reduces the editorial processing and reviewing times and shortens the overall publication time frame. Use this link to submit your article: <http://www.russianlawjournal.org/jour/author/submit>

Do editors review articles that I send by mail?

No. Please submit your article online.

How much does it cost to publish my article?

Publication is FREE of charge. And, generally, we do not pay our authors.

Does the Russian Law Journal provide English language support?

RLJ only publishes articles that were prepared in English. We do not publish translated articles. If English is not your native language, you should use a professional language editing (proofreading) service before submitting your article. When you submit your article you should also attach the text of your article with the proofreader's notes. This means that you will submit two versions of your article: (1) the final and ready-for-publication version; and (2) the version that shows the markups made by the proofreader. We also need a copy of the proofreader's CV.

Please note that a high level of language proficiency does not guarantee your article will be published. If your article is accepted, it will be checked by our copyeditors for proper style standards before publication.

How long will it take to publish my article?

RLJ is published four times a year. Each issue of the Journal undergoes peer-review and editorial quality control. The review process takes approximately 3–5 weeks. Please be informed that expedited review is not available.

Articles are published approximately six months following acceptance.

Which are the preferred topics for the articles published in the Russian Law Journal?

We are open to submissions that cover a wide range of law-related topics and viewpoints. RLJ welcomes contributions that fit the aims and scope of the Journal, with priority given to studies that analyse Russian law from a comparative perspective.

Do I need to have my topic pre-approved?

No, but the professional editors are happy to provide feedback if you would like to discuss topic ideas.

How many co-authors can submit an article?

Usually, submissions have one author. Articles written with international co-authorship are most welcome, but we can consider an article that has been prepared by no more than 2–3 authors from different countries.

I am a student. Can I submit an article to the Russian Law Journal?

Yes, you can. There is no requirement as to the academic status of the author.
