THEME

Some “integration” projects are underway on Eurasian territory. Following the dissolution of the USSR, the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) was established in 1992. It still exists, although some question its success.

The CIS has been accompanied by other, more limited, associations of States: Eurasian Economic Union, Customs Union, Collective Security Treaty Organization, and others. What are their functions? What are the results? Do these international organizations pursue “cooperation” and/or “integration”?

There is also a more limited arrangement dedicated not to integration, but to unification: the Union State of Belarus and Russia. Can it become a real State?

These developments deserve an effective analysis of the role of law in Eurasian integration, as well as the influence of such integration on contemporary legal systems. The Russian Law Journal will address these lacunae in contemporary legal theory by devoting a special issue to this topic.

Articles are invited with respect to any dimension of Eurasian legal integration, including its distinctiveness compared with other legal approaches and traditions, theoretical and historical background, or actual practice. Reference may be made to treaty relations, national legislation, judicial practice, doctrinal writings, and all other relevant materials..

- length of articles: between 8000–15000 words
- an abstract of 250 words at the beginning which explains the main points or thesis, and the conclusions drawn from it
